The Office of Professional & Continuing Studies at Loyola University New Orleans (Loyola) and the Arts and Humanities Division of Delgado Community College (Delgado) have signed a 2+2 articulation agreement. This 2+2 agreement allows students that complete the courses prescribed in Delgado's Criminal Justice Associate Degree to transfer to Loyola and will lead to a Bachelor of Criminal Justice Degree from Loyola University.

Delgado 2 Loyola

Program

Delgado Community College (Delgado) students with an associate degree in Criminal Justice will be admitted as juniors in the Professional & Continuing Studies program of Loyola University, provided they meet Loyola's admission requirements. Course requirements for Delgado's associate degree in Criminal Justice are described on page two of this document.

The total number of credit hours required to complete a bachelor's degree in criminal justice from Loyola is a minimum of 120 semester hours and students can transfer up to 60 semester hours for degree credit from Delgado to Loyola. This is a 2+2 agreement in which Delgado students will earn a bachelor's degree from Loyola after successfully completing at least 60 additional semester hours in the Criminal Justice Program at Loyola and meeting all Loyola degree requirements.

Delgado students will follow the requirements in the Loyola Undergraduate Catalog in force at the time they enter Delgado provided it is not over 10 years old and provided there was no break in enrollment of over 5 years.

In order to graduate from Loyola, students must complete at least 50% of business courses at Loyola and achieve a quality point ratio of 3.0 or better in all work attempted, all work taken at Loyola, "C" in all criminal justice courses, and 3.0 or better in all course work.



Program Evaluation



If the performance of 2+2 students is significantly lower than that of continuing Loyola students, faculty representatives from Loyola and Delgado will meet to enhance the alignment of courses from the two programs.

This agreement will be renewed every three years from the date of signing and will be continued, modified, or terminated upon mutual agreement of the parties.








