







**Loyola University New Orleans**

**Transfer Guide**

Graduates of Delgado Community College are encouraged to continue their higher education at Loyola University New Orleans to complete their bachelor's degree. Loyola provides a smooth articulation from a number of Delgado degrees and programs into baccalaureate degree programs offered in evening study through a variety of course formats. Loyola offers evening bachelor's degrees in the following majors: criminal justice, humanities, nursing and social science.

Delgado courses that have been articulated with Loyola courses are used to provide a seamless transfer of credit from a two-year institution to a four-year institution with a minimum of lost credit. Certain academic regulations apply to such transfer. General regulations include the following:

Courses identified as remedial or developmental and courses that are vocational or technical in nature do not transfer. With few exceptions, academic courses in which a grade of C or above was earned will transfer. A maximum of 64 credit hours from two-year colleges may be applied in transfer to a baccalaureate program at Loyola. At least 25% of the courses required for the bachelor's degree must be completed at Loyola. Once enrolled in a degree-seeking status, Loyola students are expected to complete the remainder of their course work at Loyola. Unless special permission is granted by the dean for the student to pursue coursework elsewhere, the final 30 credit hours must be taken at Loyola. Transfer students must complete at least one-half of the course work in the major at Loyola.

Specific plans regarding Delgado associate degree programs that articulate with evening baccalaureate degree programs at Loyola University New Orleans are attached to this general information.

## Articulation Process

In 1987 Loyola University and Delgado Community College administrators collaborated to develop a course by course transfer guide that identified which specific Delgado courses would transfer to Loyola and meet degree program requirements. That guide institutionalized the underlying transfer principle that had been followed for years: Loyola will accept in transfer from Delgado first- and second-year college-level academic courses toward bachelor degree programs.

The 1987 Transfer Guide fell short of being an actual articulation agreement between the two institutions. The Guide dealt solely with identifying course equivalents rather than communicating how Delgado's associate degree programs fit into Loyola's baccalaureate degree program requirements. Because of new programs and other changes in curricula both institutions recognized the need for updating the transfer guide and developing a more formal articulation agreement. After review from the Associate Deans from the four undergraduate colleges at Loyola and the efforts of Delgado faculty and administrators, a formal Articulation Agreement was signed in 2004.

The current articulation agreement has followed the same procedures utilizing courses and programs from Delgado's 2013-2014 Catalog along with those offered at Loyola. The individual undergraduate colleges at Loyola have the responsibility to articulate their baccalaureate programs with Delgado's associate degree programs based on this guide. This agreement will be reviewed annually on the date signed and updates will be provided regarding new and discontinued courses. A comprehensive review will take place four years from the date of signing.

Articulations for Delgado associate degree programs have been established with Loyola's evening undergraduate degree programs. Articulation agreements exist for the following Delgado-Loyola programs:

- Delgado AS in Nursing – Loyola BSN
- Delgado AA in Criminal Justice – Loyola BCJ
- Delgado AGS – Loyola BLS in Humanities
- Delgado AGS – Loyola BLS in Social Sciences
