The Department of Biological Sciences at Loyola University New Orleans, a primarily undergraduate institution, seeks highly qualified applicants for a **tenure-track Assistant Professor** position in the area of **cell and molecular biology** to begin in August 2022. Particularly desirable are individuals addressing biomedically-relevant questions using bioinformatic tools. The successful applicant will have a Ph.D. in a relevant discipline, significant post-doctoral research experience, and a strong commitment to rigorous, innovative, and inclusive teaching at the undergraduate level. Candidates are expected to develop an externally funded research program involving undergraduates. Courses to be taught include introductory biology for majors (BioInquiry, Cells & Heredity) and non-majors (Investigating Nature) and additional elective major and non-major courses according to the interests and expertise of the appointee and the needs of the department.
