# IV. Report - Active Shooter Awareness - Jayme Naquin, Director of Risk Management

Jayme Naquin spoke about the operational plans that Loyola has in place to respond to an active shooter on campus. She encouraged all faculty, staff and students to view the active shooter awareness information and video on Loyola's website. She urged everyone to download the Alertus Emergency Alert Notification on their computer. In the event of a crisis, an emergency notification will pop up on your computer screen. She said that when faced with an active shooter, there are 3 options to react in some way: run, hide or fight.

# 1.) Summer School Update - Dr. Justin Nystrom
