	English Composition	ENGL-T122 or A205	English Majors at Loyola take ENGL-A205, and most everyone else takes ENGL-T122. Other schools with a 1-class English Comp requirement can usually transfer their course as either T122 or A205. Other schools with a 2-class English Comp requirement can usually transfer the 1 st course as General Elective and the 2 nd course as T122 or A206. Loyola's Writing About Literature is a separate requirement – see below. 	Science I Depends upon degree-plan... but can satisfy the req or count in General Elective	SCIE-T129 except some STEM Majors, then, for example, BIOL-A106, CHEMA105 or PHYS A115 or A101	Any general, natural, science class can cover SCIE-T129, like astronomy, physics, geology, ecology, environment, psychology, or neuroscience including more advanced science classes like below.
